The AIHEC American Indian Measures for Success (AIHEC-AIMS) project has two goals: 1) to define relevant quantitative and qualitative indicator data of American Indian student success, as determined by the tribal colleges, and 2) to develop and implement a strategy for collecting, analyzing, and presenting annually the success indicator data using electronic information management tools. <p>Navajo Technical University has roots in the “Navajo Skills Center,” established in 1979, to assist a largely unemployed population to develop work skills so that they could find jobs in and around the Navajo Nation. The Navajo Skills Center successfully provided workforce education and assisted the graduates with obtaining jobs. As the Skills Center became more effective, the students began requiring more academic and advanced training and education. Thus, the Board of Directors encouraged the development of an educational vision to meet those needs, and in 1985, the Crownpoint Institute of Technology was created as the first higher education institution focused on vocational and technology degrees on the Navajo Nation. This led to the successful development of associate of applied science degrees (AAS) that expanded the school’s mission. No longer did the school only provide courses of study that led to professional or vocational certification, but it also offered degree programs. In 1994, the institution became part of the land grant system of colleges and universities in the United States. Then, in 2005, with another name change, Navajo Technical College (NTC) became a fully accredited institution of higher learning with the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Schools and Colleges. In 2012, the Navajo Technical College Board directed the administration to become a university. The Navajo Nation Council was approached twice before it approved the request in July 2013; the Higher Learning Commission gave its approval in fall 2013. The Navajo Nation’s first university offers ten bachelor degree programs, the only master’s degree in Diné Culture, Language and Leadership anywhere in the world, 19 associate degrees and 25 certificates. The University has three locations: Crownpoint, NM (main campus), Chinle, AZ and Teec Nos Pos, AZ.</p>	
<p><b>Please share the top two successes of your institution for Academic Year 2016-17.</b></p>	

In April of 2017, a team from Navajo Technical University attended a meeting hosted by the Great Lakes Higher Education Guaranty Corporation and the U.S. Department of Education. The meeting was called the Project Success Initiative Kickoff and the purpose of the meeting was to assist NTU with adopting strategies that lead to increasing persistence, graduation and completion rates. Principles focusing on student success and building cultures of evidence for student success were presented. NTU has since joined along with several other TCUs what has been entitled 'Project Success.'

A framework of seven key areas will be the focus of Project Success. The key areas that the Institutions Capacity Framework attribute to student success are: Leadership & Visions, Teaching & Learning, Engagement & Communication, Data & Technology, Equity, Strategy & Planning and Policies & Practices. NTU is now working with a Data Coach as well as a Leadership Coach to assist with achieving institutional transformation through sharing knowledge, creating innovative solutions and implementing effective practices and policies that lead to improved outcomes for all students. Since joining Project Success, NTU has initiated the Paid Internship, Gradready, and Emergency Aid programs to help retain and support students to completion.

Another accomplishment was recognition by the American Culinary Federation of NTU's Culinary Arts program. Navajo Technical University's Culinary Arts program earned special recognition after NTU representatives were named the ACF's Student Chef of the Year, Chef Educator of the Year, and Chef of the Year for the state of New Mexico. Earning the accolades for Student Chef of the Year was Commercial Baking major Lorena Giesbrecht of Aylmer, Ontario, Canada, while instructor Brian Tatsukawa, CCC, and program director Bob Witte, CEC, earned the Chef Educator of the Year award and Chef of the Year award, respectively.

"I wouldn't have to go to this school necessarily anymore, because I graduated. I could go to a school that's five minutes from my house rather than five hours, but I don't because this is where I got my start. This is where people believed in me," explained Giesbrecht, who lives in Las Cruces, but is from Ontario. "When I go to job interviews, they're like, 'What is NTU, where is it?'" and I tell them it's worth discovering. That's where teachers [care] about your education. They care about you as a person."

As the Chef Educator of the Year, Tatsukawa's award was described by the ACF as a tribute to an active culinary educator whose knowledge, skills, and expertise have enhanced the image of the professional chef, and who, by example, has given leadership, guidance and direction to students seeking a career in the culinary profession. Like Giesbrecht, Tatsukawa has thrived at NTU where he has developed a special connection with his students in advancing their interests and professional endeavors.

**Please share one or two significant challenges faced by your institution in AY 2016-17 (e.g., faculty changes, natural disaster, funding cuts, etc.).**

Although Navajo Technical University (NTU) has successfully increased its enrollment annually, the 2015-2016 academic year saw its first enrollment decline. The decline continued into the 2016-2017 academic year, but the decline for the 2016-2017 academic year was slight in degree. The fall 2016 enrollment was 1675, a slight decrease from the previous fall enrollment of 1686. This is in agreement with reports by the National Student Clearinghouse Research Center of a 2.0% enrollment decrease from the previous year for NM degree granting institutions, and with a national enrollment decline of 1.4% from the prior year. Enrollment management, retention and recruitment efforts have been implemented to deter enrollment drops and to assist students in completing their respective programs.

NTU still has the need for additional classroom and dormitory space, and also for faculty and staff housing. The Crownpoint campus provides 31 family housing units and two dorms with 92 rooms but there is an annual wait list for this housing. Many faculty commute to NTU, several driving over 100 miles round-trip to teach at NTU in Crownpoint, NM. NTU provides 34 housing units, including 10 mobile homes, for faculty and staff but there is a wait list for this housing. Funding from the primary grant sources has been flat, even with slight decreases, in the past several years which limits the university's ability to renovate or construct new buildings. The main campus' aging buildings are difficult to upkeep. In Crownpoint, aside from low-rent housing, there is very little housing available for rent in the community. Lack of housing for students, faculty and staff is still a critical need. The students in Chinle, AZ, continue to express desire to enroll in the four-year programs but the programs have not been extended there pending acquisition of new facilities. After years of trying, NTU acquired land in Chinle, AZ, in late 2014, and plans to design a new Chinle campus, and begin construction of an initial building

Currently, there are 12 students working on various research involving Additive Manufacturing and Metrology. Students are beginning their own research in these areas as well. Mr. Halliday has an NSF TCUP Grant for Lattice structure research that has Lawrence Livermore National Labs and University of Nebraska as its partners. Presentation will be made on December 6th in Nebraska. Research in Metrology includes CT scanning of Polymer 3D printed objects and porosity studies. Currently, Mr. Halliday is in the third year of a NSF ATE grant for metrology certification, the second year of the NSF TCUP for Lattice Structure research, the second year of a DOE/AIHEC Advanced Manufacturing Grant (partnering with 4 other TCUs), the second year of the NSF TSIP grant for Engineering Technology Education. The funding of these programs totaled \$2.2million of external funding. Mr. Halliday is 90% funded under the grants as PI.
